HARDSHIP FOR THE GOSPEL

Timothy issued a strong directive: "Bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." For the early Christians this could mean torture and execution. For most Christians today enduring hardship for the gospel might include accepting ridicule or mockery, or the suggestion that we lack sophistication. Nevertheless, in his letters, Saint Paul is adamant that we should not be ashamed of being followers of Christ. Good stewards are not ashamed of their allegiance to Christ. They do not hide their faith. Reflect on this question: Are you willing to speak about following Christ Jesus no matter who your listeners happen to be?

MEATLESS FRIDAYS

- Every person 14 years of age or older **must abstain from meat on all the Fridays of Lent**. Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat. Every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat on all other Fridays of the year, unless he or she substitutes some other form of penance for abstinence.
- Should I host a delicious Crawfish Boil on Good Friday and invite my favorite people? **No**. The whole idea behind the church's teaching of abstaining from meat is that we are sacrificing something good. Going out to a nice restaurant and eating tasty meals or partying on Good Friday are not in keeping with this spirit of sacrifice. Father Jared suggests eating a nice meal on the other days of Lent and NOT Fridays.
- We shouldn't forget that all Fridays are considered penitential days in keeping with the fact that Jesus died on Friday. Catholics should do some sort of penance on every Friday during the year. The U.S. Bishops allow the substitution of some other form of penance instead of abstaining from meat on all of the Fridays of the year, except for those Fridays in Lent. The obligation to do penance is a serious one.
